# **Our Rocket**

# **Book Summary**

Reality meets fantasy as a group of children construct and "fly" a backyard rocket.

### **Features of the Book**

- Clear type, consistently placed.
- Predictable sentence structure as a support.
- One word change per page.
- The range of verbs "fix", "screw", "staple", "tape", "glue", "tie", and "fly".
- The rhymes "tie", "fly" and "glue", "screw".
- The poetic structure.
- The visual effects photomontage on page 8.
- The high-frequency words "We" and "it".

# **Purpose**

*Our Rocket* can be used in a guided reading setting to introduce the following skills and strategies:

- recognising the relationship between letters and their sounds;
- responding to simple questions about the story's content;
- sharing ideas about the story with others in the group;
- s writing a simple set of instructions.

#### Introducing the text

Talk with the group about models they have made, for example, a car or robot.

- What did you use to make it?
- What did you use to hold it together?
- Did you have to use tools?

Encourage the group to talk about the materials and processes they used to make their model. Look at the cover and discuss the photograph.

- Can you use the photograph to find out the name of this book?
- Can you tell what the children are making?

Read the title of the book and the names of the author and photographer to the group.

# Reading the text

- Recognising the relationship between letters and their sounds.
- Responding to simple questions about the story's content.
- Sharing ideas about the story with others in the group.

# Look at the title page.

- What are these children doing?
- Which part of the rocket are they making?

Pages 2 to 7 – Look at each photograph and talk about the action.

- What are the children doing?
- What tools are they using?
- What are they using to make the rocket? (wood, paper, tape, string)

# Page 8

- What is happening here?
- Do you think this really happened?
- How would they make a photograph like this?

The children now read the book independently.

# Revisiting the text

You could discuss the tools that could be used to make a rocket. Mime the action of using each tool.

- Could they have joined the pieces together in any other way?
- Which word changes on each page? (the second word in each sentence)

#### Following Up

- S Writing a simple set of instructions.
- The children could use a large cardboard box to construct a model, then write a simple set of instructions about what they did.
- **E** Complete the blackline master opposite.
